

Timothy Searchinger is a Senior Fellow at the Georgetown Environmental Law and Policy Institute, as well as a Visiting Scholar at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School and a Transatlantic Fellow at the German Marshall Fund. For many years he was a Senior Attorney at Environmental Defense, where he co-founded the Center for Conservation Incentives and directed work on agricultural policy. A graduate of Yale Law School where he was Senior Editor of the Yale Law Journal, Searchinger has been a clerk to Judge Edward Becker on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit, a Deputy General Counsel to Governor Robert P. Casey, and most recently a special adviser to the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources in Maryland on Chesapeake Bay issues. He has written extensively about wetlands, takings, flood policy and is writing a book on agriculture and the environment.
